## President's Challenge

As your Guild President this year, I am issuing a President's challenge. I am calling it:

### **The Guild Member Encounter: Make a Napkin Edition.**

To participate, you will need to fill out a form. The form is shown below in the newsletter, and online at the guild website at this link: [HERE](#) You can print it out and bring it with you to either the September or October guild meeting, or fill it out online and we will print it out, or we will have forms at the meeting for you to fill out. So many ways to participate!

On that form you will find questions about **yourself**. For example: your Favorite Color, Astrological Sign, Most Unusual Pet, Favorite Winter Activity, Favorite Holiday Desert. All these questions are intended to be low stress and fun. If there are any questions that you do not like, or that make you uncomfortable, please feel free to ignore them. This is intended to be fun.

So now you are wondering how filling out a form about **yourself** will help you learn about someone else. Ahh, that is the heart of this challenge. At the October meeting, you will randomly pick someone else's form and then go home and create a napkin for that person. The challenge is to use something from the information on the form to create a napkin specially for that person.

### **Challenge requirements:**

Finally, the nitty gritty details! There are just three requirements for this challenge.

- #1. Create a napkin for your fellow guild member in whatever fiber art medium makes you happy and will produce a napkin that you might like to receive, and use. **You may weave or knit or tat or crochet or sew or appliqué or hand-dye fabric or use any other way that you can think of to create a napkin.** Please do not use wool or other animal fibers for the napkin. The finished size of the napkin should be a minimum of 10" square. If it is slightly smaller, no one is going to confiscate your hard work, but try not to make it too small.
- #2. Use something from the questions on the form to influence your design. I have included a few obvious questions to help make this easier, but please use your imagination to design something that reflects the person you are making it for.



#3. Please make a commitment to bring the item, in person, to the December meeting. And make a commitment to attend the meeting to receive your item. Please also be prepared to introduce your fellow guild member and present your item to the lucky recipient. If you are uncomfortable with public speaking, please let me (Katz) know, and I would be happy to make the presentation for you.

And finally, here is the form for you to fill out. I hope you have fun and enjoy the challenge!

Program: History of the Guild by Rebecca Winter

- President Mary Berent welcomed everyone, the meeting starting with Rebecca's Guild history program.

Business

- Mary Berent mentioned the free table, which is at every Guild meeting for members to enjoy and peruse.
- Katzy Luhring, incoming President, had plants and thank you notes for Guild volunteers.



- Membership – Cindy Griewe
  - Cindy reminded members to renew their membership by the end of June at the \$30 rate.
- Treasurer – Kelly Sandusky
  - Kelly was closing the books at the end of June, which is the end of the Guild’s fiscal year.
- Incoming Vice Presidents – Lisa Baker and Robin Conrads
  - Lisa spoke of the Diversified Plain Weave Workshop presented by Vila Cox. The workshop will be held at the Bowmont Church of the Brethren on Second Street in Bowmont, Idaho. The cost is \$140 and there are three spots left. Attendees can pay for the workshop now, and checks will be held until the week before the workshop starts.
  - Robin announced that the September program that follows the Regular Guild meeting will be Linda Morton-Keithley and Irma Atkinson’s trip to Spain.

President’s Report

- Katzy called the meeting to order 7:02PM. She asked all participants to choose a color that represented their summer.
- Committee Chair Positions
  - Katzy checked with every committee chair, and all agreed to remain in their current position.
- President’s Challenge
  - Katzy will announce a challenge to make a napkin (10x10 inches at a minimum) for another Guild member.



- She will put an announcement in the newsletter with a sign-up form which she will also provide at the September Regular meeting.
- These forms will be collected and then disbursed randomly/chosen out of a hat at the October Regular meeting. Robin suggested a Google form for online submissions as well.
- Each participant will create one napkin and give that to their chosen subject at the December Regular meeting.

- There will be no September Board meeting.

#### Vice Presidents' Report

- Monthly Meeting Programs

- Robin discussed the October program: Tips and Tricks. A moderator would be needed to keep the flow of the program. She will mention at the September Regular meeting for members to sign up to present a tip as well as follow up with those sign-ups via email. Robin will also provide suggested tips topics.
- Robin will provide a list of the programs: Rebecca will put upcoming program in newsletter, Robin will put the same information on the website, and Dyan will include this on Facebook and Instagram.



- Workshops for 2025-2027

- Lisa looking for guidance on the types of workshops the membership would like to attend.
  - Connie suggested using archived past membership forms that included this information.
  - It was discussed to create a groups.io poll to include fiber demographics questions, interests, etc. as well as general workshop and study group topics. Lisa will write up poll questions with positive messaging.
  - Mary reiterated the cost effectiveness of the Guild's workshop offerings as opposed to ANWG and other group's workshop costs.
  - Rigid heddle popularity and study group needs was discussed.
  - Lisa will send an email to the Board with potential 2027 workshop ideas.
- 2026
  - Lisa will provide Deb Essen a contract for a June 2026 workshop.
  - There was discussion about offering a Fall 2026 workshop.
  - Currently planned are the January Intensive and the Beginning Weaving Study Group workshop in April.

#### Treasurer's Report

- Square Transaction Surplus
  - The Board agreed that any surplus from Square transactions will be added to the general fund.
- Newsletter Mailing
  - Currently there are four subscribers that pay \$20/year to have the newsletter mailed to them monthly.
  - The actual cost is \$27/year so Katzy suggested the Guild increases the hard copy subscription to \$30/year to over the costs.
  - The Board agreed to leave the current subscription rate as is, and Kelly will revisit this issue with the Board in March 2026.
- The IRS report (filed between June and October) will be completed by Dyan in August 2025.
- The Zoom renewal will be made by Dyan in Fall 2025, and the Guild will reimburse her.
- Vila is taking lead on discussing monthly or quarterly invoicing from the Church for the facility rental.

#### Equipment Rentals

- The Board discussed the current rental fee structure, the proceeds going into the general fund.
- The annual budget includes a line item for replacement/new equipment.



- In 2024-2025, equipment rentals accounted for \$272, and \$260 was budgeted for new/replacements.
- Mary gave kudos to Vila for organizing the equipment and building the rental program for the members' benefit as well as keeping on top of all equipment activities.
- The J-Made Floor Loom may be replaced next year; the Guild needs an 8-shaft fold up loom to meet members' needs.
- There was discussion on other new equipment needs and what gets rented the most.
- The Board decided to keep the pricing (below) for the 2025-2026 Guild season.

#### Secretary's Report

- Website
  - The Board accepted Dyan's front page revisions, and Dyan will send the new text to Robin to update the website.
- Affiliations
  - Current affiliations: Lunatic Fringe Yarns and The Woolery.
  - New: Windmill Crest Farms
  - Dyan is currently working on adding WEBS, Halcyon Yarn and Vermon Weaving Supplies.

#### Membership Report

- There are 97 paid members for the 2025-2026 year to date.
- Advertisers
  - Now that the membership directory is solely online, the Board discussed advertising, the process, current costs and fees, etc.
  - In the last hard copy directory, there were 12-13 ads. Cindy emailed all advertisers earlier in the year to let them know the Board would need to decide the future of advertising with the Guild.
  - The Board decided to not offer advertising opportunities in the newsletter or the website to keep both vehicles ad free.
  - Only active members can "advertise" via groups.io.
  - There will be a future motion to change the membership officer role policy to remove advertising duties.
- Membership Directory
  - The current directory is on groups.io, last updated in May. Cindy will update that file after the September Regular meeting and email the updated version in October and January.
  - There is no affiliate membership, and the Board decided to keep the status quo of one person-one membership.
- Cindy will not be at the September Regular meeting so Robin will take care of the Membership table.



## Webmasters

- Robin updated the meeting dates and dues information.
- Robin will check when annual domain and hosting payments are due.
- Workshop Payments Online
  - Square can be used online for workshop payments.
  - Robin will explore refunding fees.

## ANWG

- Connie discussed the ANWG membership dues that are due soon.
  - Dues are \$1.00 per guild member based on the guild membership as of June 30 of that year. The Board decided to pay \$121 based on the latest member count in May 2025.
  - Connie will complete the renewal form; Kelly will provide the check.
- Meeting Hosting
  - In July 2025, the Board discussed an inquiry from Dan Steves (ANWG Board) regarding whether the Boise Guild might host ANWG 2027, possibly in Coeur d'Alene. After review, the consensus was to decline hosting in 2027 and not pursue Coeur d'Alene as a location. Several Board members noted that hosting should only be considered if the Guild is prepared to manage the majority of the work internally, with optional outside assistance.
  - Interest was expressed in exploring the possibility of hosting a future ANWG conference in Boise in 2029 or later, depending on whether other guilds are already committed. Members also noted the opportunity to observe and shadow the 2027 host guild to gain insights for potential future hosting. The importance of broad enthusiasm and participation from the Guild membership for any hosting commitment was emphasized.
  - It was agreed that further discussion of future ANWG hosting opportunities will be addressed at a future date to be determined.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:55PM.

The next Board meeting is scheduled for November 1.
